BASIC CONVERSATIONAL SPANISH I

Introduction

- The short-term Spanish language courses are for individuals who are interested in improving their proficiency in the language within a short duration.
- A communicative approach is utilised in the course's teaching and learning process, coupled with the use of the most up-to-date audio-visual technology available.

Objective

- The objective is to help students achieve a measure of basic communicative competence that will allow them to interact comfortably in everyday situations.

Content

- Greetings, conversing about identities (e.g. name, age, country of origin, profession, marital status and languages spoken), introductions, describing people, common expressions, placing orders at restaurant and making room reservations.

Entry Level

- Beginners
- Minimum age: 16 and above

Duration

- 5 weeks (10 sessions)
- Total: 20 contact hours
- Date: 9 July 2018 – 10 Aug 2018

Schedule

- Monday and Wednesday, 5pm – 7pm

Venue

- Building D09/Room 206, School of Languages, Literacies and Translation

Fee

- RM600 per person/course (inclusive of materials)
