### BASIC CONVERSATIONAL KOREAN I

#### Introduction

- The short-term Korean language courses are for individuals who are interested in improving their proficiency in the language within a short duration.
- This course is designed for student to learn basic Korean Language. Students are expose to listening, reading, speaking and writing skills with basic vocabulary, grammar, and sentence structure.
- To expose students to real daily situations which will help them to communicate using Korean Language.

#### Objective

- The objective of this course is to help students to have a good command of basic conversational Korean language, including greetings, self-introduction, asking question, ordering food, purchasing goods, asking for directions, phone conversation, etc

#### Content

- Korean script "한글 HANGUL" with correct pronunciations, greetings & introduction, describing things with demonstratives, ordering items, asking for and giving locations, making phone calls, talking about daily life and Korean cooking and food.

#### Entry Level

- Beginners
- Minimum age: 16 and above

#### Duration

- 5 weeks (10 sessions)
- Total: 20 contact hours
- Date: 22 July 2019 – 23 Aug 2019

#### Schedule

- Monday and Wednesday, 5pm – 7pm

#### Venue

- Building D09/Room 204, School of Languages, Literacies and Translation

#### Fee
